

Anything suspicious you see should be made known to the police. You can do this any one of the following ways:

Dial 999 - to report any genuine emergency. However - only an emergency - we must all do our bit not to waste the time of the emergency services by mis-using the 999 service.

Dial 101 and report it that way

Notes from our Parish Meeting



A huge thank you to everyone who joined us, on what started off as a very wet Saturday morning in September for our Parish meeting.

Over cups of tea at the Village Hall, we spent the morning discussing a variety of issues and ideas, key themes were:

Road safety

Perhaps unsurprisingly, road safety was one of the biggest causes for concern. We discussed concerns with the chicane on Mellor Lane and speeding on Mellor Lane, Barker Lane and Mellor Brow. As a Highways matter, these sit with Lancashire County Council and were raised with Councillor Alan Schofield at the Parish Council meeting in October.

The environment

We discussed a number of ways we could all help to keep the Parish green – from reducing plastic use and making recycling easier, to encouraging healthier decisions through cycling or walking more.

Those at the meeting also suggested we could organise a volunteer litter picking group, Councillors Murtagh and Venables are looking into this so please get in touch if you'd like to volunteer!

Activities for young people & children

There was lots of great feedback on the investment to the park and we also touched on what we could do for the slightly older children. We were reminded of the clubs and activities at the village hall (such as Judo or the Brass Band) but promised to look into this further, if you have any ideas or want to volunteer to run an activity do get in touch.

Reduce, re-use, recycle

We all lead busy lives and ways to save time and increase convenience are important. But the environment is also important, for us and for future generations.

That's why we must all do everything we can to reduce the amount of waste we generate, and whenever possible re-use or recycle materials such as glass, metals and plastics.

Ribble Valley Borough Council has recently improved it's waste recycling capability and since October 1st we can recycle all clean plastic pots, tubs and trays with the grades 1, 2 and 5 recycling triangles on the packaging. This covers the vast majority of plastic packaging for food and drinks but please always check before putting in your blue bin.

Balderstone and District WI Centenary Year

As the second oldest Women's Institute in Lancashire Balderstone and District WI celebrated it's centenary year in style.

The year was launched at our "birthday party" meal, at which members were presented with a specially designed brooch and entertained by the Mellor Brook Ukulele band.

In summer 19 members spent the weekend at Waddow Hall with archery, zip wiring and a variety of walks.

Members were also treated to a special visit to the new Thwaites brewery where a commemorative "Centenary Ale" was created for us.

We currently have 41 active members (including two who have been in the WI for over 50 years). We meet on the second Tuesday of the month at 7.30 pm, at Mellor Brook Community Centre.

We have presentations on a range of topics and also have a craft and natter group, a walking group and a social group which organises a variety of outings and events.

Anti-Social Behaviour

We have recently received reports of anti-social behaviour involving children and young people congregating in areas around Mellor. These include the garage site off Mellor Lane, the Doctor's Surgery and Library surrounds, and in and around the play area on St Mary's Gardens with residents complaining they are witnessing bad language, shouting, abuse of play area equipment, aggressively kicked footballs and are experiencing verbal abuse from children they believe to be local. With some of this involving older children using the play area, we wanted to reiterate that the play area is designed for younger children (up to 12 years) to enjoy,

Parishioners will know that over £40,000 has recently been spent on the play area. Funded by grants and the Parish precept we have improved the facility, drainage and surrounds. Disappointingly some equipment has already been damaged - we believe due to it being over-loaded (i.e. groups of children climbing on the equipment).

The Parish Council asks that residents report all incidents to our PC Duncan Park (see page 2 for contact details) and, that parents/guardians please remind older children that the play area equipment is only for those children 12 and under. There are a number of organisations in and around Mellor for younger people and both Mellor Village Hall and the Mellor Brook Community Centre have facilities for all residents although if anyone is interested in setting up new groups that might engage young people please do let us know.

Together, for everyone's benefit, we can prevent anti-social behaviour escalating out of control.

Top tips for keeping safe this winter

On cold mornings, don't leave your car running, unattended – As well as causing pollution, if anything happens to it, your insurance will likely be void

Heat your home well & if you feel cold at night, use a hot water bottle to keep the costs down

Stock up on salt/grit – it's also useful to have a snow shovel, torch, batteries & a first aid kit handy

Eat well and have plenty of fluids, they are vital sources of energy and help to keep your body warm

Keep an eye on friends, relatives and older neighbours who may be vulnerable to the cold weather

Never use a hot water bottle and electric blanket in the same bed together. Check what sort of electric blanket you have as not all are designed to be left on overnight.

Get a free flu jab if you are over 65, pregnant or have a long term health condition

2020/21 Parish Council Budget and Precept

Following meetings of the Parish Council Finance Working Party it has been agreed that the precept for 2020/21 will be set at £24000.

This equates to an amount per household of £24.46 (Band D equivalent) and will enable the Parish Council to support activities for the benefit of residents while maintaining a prudent level of reserve contingency funds.

Councillor Spotlight - Cllr Nick Marsden

I spent my formative years growing up on the edge of the Ribble Valley and have worked in the area ever since. Most of my free time was taken up playing sport at club, town and county level. I became Chairman of Blackburn Northern in 2002 and President 11 years later.

I moved to Mellor with my wife, Julie, in 1986, joining the Parish Council in 2014. I bring a wealth of commercial and managerial experience to the Council.



As Vice Chairman, I am committed to getting the best possible outcomes for work undertaken within the parish. I am conscious that Councillors have to listen carefully to the views of our residents to ensure that the precept is used to enhance both the parish and the lives of those living within it.

During my time on the Council we have seen the introduction of 20 mph speed limits, traffic calming measures; closer liaison between MCA and MPC; security cameras and improved lighting at the hall, a £40k redevelopment of the Play Area; investment at the War Memorial; successful campaigns to retain both the Doctor's Surgery and the Library and closer links with RVBC and Lancashire County Council.

The Finance Working Party, under my Chairmanship, has identified key areas of investment in the parish over the next 12-24 months. I hope to update you in future issues of the newsletter.
